



2019 HEDIS® MEASURE: CHILDREN AND ADOLESCENTS' ACCESS TO PRIMARY CARE PRACTITIONERS (CAP)

Gold Coast Health Plan's goal is to help its providers gain compliance with their annual Healthcare Effectiveness Data and Information Set (HEDIS®) scores by providing guidance and resources. This tip sheet will provide the key components to the HEDIS® measure, "Children and Adolescents' Access to Primary Care Practitioners (CAP)."

Measure Description: Members ages 12 months to 19 years who had a visit with their Primary Care Physician (PCP) during the measurement year.

Members must have had one or more ambulatory or preventive care visits with a PCP during the measurement year.

Compliance for this measure requires:

- ▶ Members ages 12 months to 6 years to have one or more PCP visits within the measurement year.
- OR**
- ▶ Members ages 7 to 19 years to have one or more visits with the PCP during the measurement year or the year prior.

Four rates are reported based on the following age groups:

- ▶ 12 to 24 months
- ▶ 25 months to 6 years
- ▶ 7 to 11 years
- ▶ 12 to 19 years

Codes used to identify ambulatory visits to a primary care practitioner.

Best Practices:

- ▶ Use gap lists to help manage your total population.
- ▶ Make outreach calls and/or send letters to advise members / parents on the need for a visit.
- ▶ Stress the importance of the preventive / ambulatory visit to assess growth and development, provide immunizations, and to provide anticipatory guidance on diet, activity, safety, etc.
- ▶ Consider the parent's work schedule as a barrier to the visit, and offer extended evening or weekend hours.
- ▶ Partner with CDPHP staff to assist with targeted outreach activities.
- ▶ Begin scheduling visits toward the beginning of the measurement year to allow for additional scheduling opportunities, if needed, throughout the year.
